2023-24 ADULT PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- > January's exhibition opening reception welcomed a record 400 attendees.
- > 88 Art School classes & workshops continued the spirit of experimentation in modern art.
- > 12 Last Wednesdays monthly events opened the gallery in the evening, and also featured either an art talk, history talk, tour with the Curator, or even a popular poetry workshop.


